

HEALTH DEPARTMENT

GOVT. MULTI-SPECIALITY HOSPITAL-16

(1) Health and Wellness Centers:

The Health Department has established 10 Health & Wellness Centres wherein 12 comprehensive Health services alongwith YOGA are being provided. Comprehensive Primary Health Care portal implemented for reporting the Health Care Delivery services of Health and Wellness Centres.

(2) Pradhan Mantri Jan-ArogyaYojana(PMJAY):

Under *Prime Minister Jan ArogyaYojana (PMJAY)*, Socio Economic Caste Census was conducted and data for 71,278 families were made available with total family members of 1,06,500 individual. The Health Department identified physically available person on the basis of residential address specified by SECC and after due verification by Health department generated Golden Record of 19,086 and card issued. Number of empanelled hospitals are 12 and 270 patients enjoyed the benefit under this scheme.

(3) Pradhan MantriMatruVandanaYojana(PMMVY):

This is a Maternity Benefit Programme under which all Pregnant Women and Lactating Mothers, who are pregnant on or after 01.01.2017 for first child in family given cash incentive of Rs 5000 in three instalments i.e. first instalment of Rs. 1000/- on early registration of pregnancy at the Anganwadi Centre (AWC)/approved Health facility, second installment of Rs 2000/- after six months of pregnancy on receiving at least one ante-natal check-up (ANC) and third instalment of Rs 2000/- after child birth is registered and the child has received the first cycle of BCG, OPV, DPT and Hepatitis - B, or its equivalent/substitute. The eligible beneficiaries receives the incentive given under the Janani Suraksha Yojana(JSY) for Institutional delivery and the incentive received under JSY would be accounted towards maternity benefits so that on an average a woman gets Rs 6000/-. The Health Department has set up dedicated help desk in each hospital where the beneficiaries are registered and data base are shared with the other Govt. Hospitals in the city.

- *The Targets given for December 2018 and March 2019 have been achieved - More than 100%.*
- *Chandigarh has been enlisted in Top performing UTs in the latest update by Government of India.*
- *Chandigarh stands 5th in all India ranking in terms of achievement of targets as shared by Government of India.*

(4) Janani Suraksha Yojana:

This is a safe motherhood intervention under the National Rural Health Mission (NHM) which is being implemented with the objective of reducing maternal and infant mortality by promoting institutional delivery among pregnant women. All pregnant women belonging to the **Below Poverty Line (BPL)** households and SC/ST category and those declared as "poor for the entitlement of Janani Suraksha Yojana" by Chandigarh Administration. Cash Incentive of Rs. 600 per institutional delivery is given to the entitled beneficiaries.

(5) Janani Shishu Suraksha Karyakaram:

The scheme is to benefit pregnant women who access Government health facilities for their delivery. The pregnant women whose delivery is done in public health institutions to absolutely free and no expense delivery, including caesarean section.

- The entitlements include free drugs and consumables, free diet up to 3 days during normal delivery and up to 7 days for C-section, free diagnostics, and free blood wherever required. This initiative also provides for free transport from home to institution, between facilities in case of a referral and drop back home. Similar entitlements have been put in place for all sick newborns accessing public health institutions for treatment till 30 days after birth. This has now been expanded to cover sick infants:
- The scheme aims to eliminate out of pocket expenses incurred by the pregnant women and sick newborn while accessing services at Government health facilities.
- The Health Department has set up dedicated help desk in each hospital where the beneficiaries are registered and data base are shared with the other Govt. Hospitals in the city.

(6) National Health Mission, U.T, Chandigarh :

- **National Ambulance Service 108(NAS):** implemented as per guideline of Ministry of Health and Family Welfare. 7866 beneficiaries have availed the service in. F.Y. 2018-19.
- Data Capturing and validation: Implementation of RCH Portal (<https://rch.nhm.gov.in>) – it is a beneficiary related portal and once a pregnant woman is registered the tracking is done till the full immunization of the delivered baby is completed. It is a Govt. of India Initiative for tracking of timely delivery of Maternal and Child Health Services in UT Chandigarh. ANMOL (ANM Online) Tablets :- 70 number of ANMOL tablets have been procured and distributed for rolling out ANM Online service in RCH. HMIS (Health Management Information System):-100% Facility Based data reporting

- Five Star Ratings :-Two Health facilities i.e. CH Manimajra and MCH 22 Chandigarh have been grouped under the category of five star ratings of CHCs in HMIS UT Chandigarh
- MeraAasptal Status of Patients Satisfaction Score of Hospitals: MeraAasptal application implemented for acknowledging the patient feedback for patient satisfaction scores of hospital in two city hospitals (GMSH Sector 16 CH Sector 45) online application of MeraAasptal and likely to be extended to other health facility shortly.

(7) Achievement of Chandigarh in terms of Awards:

- Chandigarh bagged the National Award for the 1st Position (among the Union Territories) in reduction of Infant Mortality Rate at 5th National Summit - Good and Replicable Practices in Public Healthcare Systems in India.
- Health Department received the Cash Prize of Rs. 10,00,000/- in 6th JRD Tata Memorial Award for sustained efforts in stabilizing population levels and best performing state in reproductive health, gender equality and women empowerment.
- Kayakalp Award by Union Health Minister Sh. J.P Nadda at Second National Quality Convention in Public Health held at New Delhi.
- SKOCH - Order Of Merit Awards 2018 (Three) :
- TarreZameen Par-Night Vigil – For reaching the unreached in the Pulse Polio Campaign
- PMSMA (Pradhan MantriSurakshitMatritv Abhiyan)- To improve the Maternal Health component.
- Kayakalp Award- For UCHC-45
- SKOCH Award for Swasth Bharat 2019:
- The first award received by Health Department, U.T. Chandigarh is for its commendable efforts in controlling the epidemic of Malaria and Dengue during the year 2018-19 in U.T. Chandigarh.
- The second award has been conferred for making significant impact and contribution in tackling the problem of Malnourishment in children. The establishment of Nutritional Rehabilitation Centre at GMSH-16 for extending Intensive services to malnourished children especially of slums and colonies for improving their nutritional status has been appreciated
- The third award has been conferred for **Drug De-addiction Rehabilitation Services** which are being provided to the patients to make them free from drug abuse so that they are able to join the mainstream for a better life ahead. The efforts of Health Department in this venture have been adjudged as 'Very Good' as per the Standard Protocols.
- The fourth award has been conferred for the inculcation of Yoga in the residents of U.T. Chandigarh. The intensive percolation of awareness regarding Yoga and its extension to the community by way of appointing Yoga teachers in schools, holding yoga sessions in health facilities and

making mandatory provision of yoga classes at Health and Wellness Centers has been appreciated and said to be exemplary.

“ACHIEVEMENTS UNDER VARIOUS NATIONAL HEALTH PROGRAMMES”

(1) Universal Immunization Programme (UIP):

- 100% full immunization achieved as per the target of 16000 children (as accessed during the Health Survey)
- 86.81 % achieved against the target of 19,200 Children (as conveyed by GOI)
- 100% saturation achieved under Mission Indradhanush (An activity carried out to cover the dropout children and Pregnant Women from Immunization)
- Successful implementation of Weekly Iron Folic Acid Programme under **Rashtriya Kishore SwasthyaKaryakram**

(2) Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme(RNTCP):

- The success rate of treatment is 81% (New Cases) and 72% (Retreatment cases) as per the data of State Performance in NIKSHAY
- **Free X-ray facilities** are being provided for suspected TB patients and diagnosed TB patients.
- Rs. 500/- per month to each TB diagnosed patient is being provided through **Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT)** by linkage through Aadhar Card and Bank Account Number. Till date **45,18,500 Rs./-** has been paid under DBT.
- **Incentive of Rs. 1000/-** to each person/ NGOs/ Patients himself/ family member/Private Practitioner who will inform about the TB patient taking treatment from private sector. (500 on notification and 500 on treatment completion)
- A **high protein diet** is provided to MDR/XDR TB patients from UT resources.

(4) National AYUSH Mission (NAM):

- There are 28 Health Facilities in Chandigarh where AYUSH (Homeopathy/Ayurvedic/Unani) services are being provided in Chandigarh.
- The AYUSH facilities for Homeopathy (1.29 lakh) Ayurvedic (70,000) Unani (89,000) Panchkarma (More than Two Thousand) have been availed by the beneficiaries
- Number of Yoga Centers in schools has been increased to 49 schools from 25 school in the last year.
- Mobile AYUSH Dispensary has catered to 7609 no. of patients.

ONGOING PROGRAMMES UNDER GMSH-16(2018-19):

- Five Centres are going to be upgraded into AYUSH-Health & Wellness Centre.
- Purchase of 100 Tablets for ANM in process at approximate cost of Rs.19.00 lakh
- Providing 10 Smart Health Information KIOSK for HWC so that beneficiary can obtain, transmit, share real-time preventive measures related to Diseases, YOGA and Wellness advices. The devices will be made functional through the joint support and efforts of Central Health Institute New Delhi and National Health Mission UT Chandigarh.
- 80 Bedded Hospital Maloya construction is going to start for which administrative approval has been received from higher authorities
- **Up-gradation of AYUSH Dispensaries** is under active progress for which Engineering Department has been requested to give their recommendations alongwith rough cost estimate. It is likely to be completed in the year 2019-20.

- **Equipment machinery:**

The equipments which have lived their life need replacement/New Procurement. The department is going to procure following equipments for providing better health facilities in due course of time:-

Medicine: ECHO cardiography machine, portal echocardiography, Holtar recording system, Treadmill machine, ECG machine, Defibrillators , Multi-parameter Cardiac monitor , Video Colonoscope etc.

Physiotherapy: CPM, Multigym exercise, Vibrations and siprometer for ICU patients.

Radiology: Fixed X-ray Machine, Retrogit DR two detectors , Mobile X-ray machine, Fixed 300mA X-ray machine, CR system, USG machine Doppler 4 D with contrast enhancement(Mid range), DRF

ENT: Camera & monitor for FESS, Micro debrider, Operating microscope for ENT, Impedance audiometer.

Blood Bank: Bench top tube sealers, Platelet Agitator and incubator.

Eye: Auto refracts keratometer, A-Scan, Revolving Vision Drum, Trolley for Flash Autoclave, YAG Laser

Pathology (Laboratory): Fully automated 5 part haematology analyzer, Coagulation analyzer , Immunoassay analyzer, Semi automated ELISA Washer & Reader,

	Benchtop Laboratory Centrifuge etc.
Skin :	Laser-Q Switched laser for dermal naevi, Hyfreator, Centrifuge machine with PRP tubes to start platelet rich plasma therapy, Micro Dermabrader.
Dental:	Dental Laser, LED Screen, fully equipped dental chair , wall mounted dental unit with RVG autoclave.
Psychiatry :	Computer and printer , Photostat machine etc
Gynae/ Peadetic/ Lab :	NST Machine , Hysterectomy set , Autoclave machine horizontal , laundry unit with dryer, cardiac monitor, Labour table, pulse oximeter , Electrolyte analyzer , fully automatic analyzer 300 test etc.
Malaria Department:	Fogging machine, vehicles, computer, public address system etc.

PROPOSED PROGRAMMES UNDER GMSH-16(2019-20)

(a)Health

- The Health Department mainly requires to be strengthened by availability of Manpower/Equipment/Machinery/Material.
- The flagship programmes of the health department will remain focused on information technology i.e. Computerization of Primary and Secondary level of health facilities to implement the module of e-hospital in uniformity/ the application under National Health Mission (NHM) i.e. Hospital Management Information System (HMIS)/Reproductive and Child Health (RCH) portal /NIKSHAY (for capturing data related to tuberculosis) etc.
- The statutory laws applicable under the Acts for which application forms and other issues are to be made online i.e. Drugs and Cosmetics Acts, PCPNDT Act, Clinical Establishment Act, MTP Act etc.
- All Civil dispensaries in U.T. Chandigarh (10 have already been upgraded) will be declared as Health & Wellness Centres (H&WC) under National Health Mission for providing 12 number of comprehensive health services in uniformity in all health facilities including Yoga.
- The Health & Wellness centres will be provided with dental chairs (where the same are not available) in order to provide dental services in the health & wellness centres of U.T. Chandigarh.
- The labour rooms of all health facilities are to be accredited under Laqshya programmes directives of Govt. of India, for which the renovation/ construction/ equipment/ machinery/ instruments will be made available at par with Govt. of India guidelines to qualify the same under the scheme.

- The 100 bedded Hospital at sector 48, Chandigarh has been constructed by the Engg. Department, U.T. Chandigarh, the functioning of the same is to be started by GMCH-32 after the Model Code of Conduct.
- The proposal for establishment of Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory on pattern of Govt. of Haryana is under process wherein the space will be provided by health department and the partner will setup the same including manpower, machinery, equipments and will provide the service 24x7 in articulation with ICU setup by Health Department in the recent past.
- Civil Hospital-22, Civil Hospital-45, Civil Hospital-Manimajra are to be provided with Chemists shops, the approval of which has been given for running Jan Aushadhi by Indian Red Cross Society, U.T. Chandigarh.
- On the recommendation of administrative Advisory Council as approved by the Chandigarh Administration vide Order No. 9/9I-IH (I)-2019/6755 dated 25.04.2019, the following actions is to be done after the Code of Conduct:-
 - *Outsourcing of diet in hospitals/Health Institutions*
 - *Double timing of dispensaries/availability of the manpower*
 - *Biometric Attendance at all the health facilities.*

(b) Manpower:

- To expedite the filling up of 52 number of medical officer posts through UPSC.
- The sanction of 248 no. of posts under group A, B & C at the level of Govt. of India are to be got sanctioned for smooth functioning of Health Facilities in U.T Chandigarh
- The proposal for 24 no. of Diplomat of National Board (DNB) seats (Post graduation in department of Anaesthesia (8 seats), ENT(2 seats), Pathology(4 seats), Radiology(4 seats), Emergency Medicine(2 seats), Skin(2 seats), Eye(2 seats)) have been recommended to Govt. of India as per their directions the budget of which is to be made available during the year 2019-20 (Subject to approval thereof by Govt. of India).
- All the sanctioned vacant posts of Paramedical/Ministerial Staff are required to be filled up in F.Y. 2019-20.

(c) Equipment Machinery:

The equipments which have lived their life need replacement/ New Procurement needs to be purchased

(d) Material Supply :

The hospital will procure the medicines/consumables/anaesthesia gases/ linen/sanitation/surgical items /laundry material/ diet etc. as per the laid down procedure for smooth functioning of indoor and outdoor services of health facilities under health department U.T Chandigarh.

(e) Construction:

- Proposal of new hospitals at Maloya/Dhanas , U.T. Chandigarh.
- The multi level parking is to be taken on priority in GMSH-16 for overcrowding of vehicles.
- The fire safety compliance of all the health facilities.

(f) Establishment of Academic Wing in o/o Medical Superintendent:

- The admissions under DNB/Senior Residency, House Surgeons/Interns and approvals given for various training in Medical/Paramedical courses for which the Ministerial Manpower is required to be engaged on contract/outsourced basis for smooth maintenance of records/receipts of payments/award of certificates etc
- The office is to be established for proper usage and record of RogiKalyanSamitis (RKS) in the office of Medical Superintendent in which the user charges of the hospital are being deposited. The Ministerial manpower is required to be engaged on contract/outsourced basis for proper maintenance of records/agendas, record of proceedings etc.

(g) AYUSH

- **AYUSH Integrated Hospital**, Sector-34, Chandigarh- Deposit Work for renovation/construction is likely to be completed in the year 2019-20.
- **NavgrahaVatikais** being implemented in AYUSH Dispensaries on the pattern of Govt. of Haryana.
- **AYUSH Gram:-**
 - Villages Palsora, Sarangpur and Faidan have been adopted as AYUSH Gram under NAM where various activities for spreading awareness regarding AYUSH health services alongwith other National Health Programmes will be organized in a systematic phase wise manner.
 - A booklet incorporating achievements of AYUSH alongwith National Health Mission is being printed.

MAJOR CHALLENGES:

(i) Slashing of Resource Envelope of NHM:

National Health Mission has been constantly supporting the Health Department, Chandigarh by sanction of manpower and activities which are essential and instrumental in meeting out the targets for National Health Programmes. Over the last two years the Resource Envelope is being reduced constantly thereby decreasing the availability of budget to engage the manpower.

This shall be hampering the health care delivery services unhindered 24 X 7 to the beneficiaries

(ii) Manpower:

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GOVERNMENT MEDICAL COLLEGE & HOSPITAL (GMCH-32)

MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS 2018-2019

- Govt. of India launched the Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) which will be the world's largest govt. funded health protection scheme. The scheme has been adopted and implemented successfully in GMCH from 1st October, 2018. GMCH was the first in Tricity to have successfully operated first patient under Ayushman Bharat Scheme.
- Ayushman Bharat Cell is constituted in Procurement Branch-II
- With the start of Department of Emergency Medicine, triage services have been started in GMCH.
- Post-graduation seats have increased from 119 to 128.
- GMCH is the first in Tricity to install composting machine to process its own wet waste. Installation of more composting machines is in process.
- Supply order for the purchase of various equipments i.e. Cardio Tocograph machines (02 nos.), high speed electric burr (02 nos.), Neonatal resuscitation cum open care system (06 nos.), Video laryngoscope set etc. have been issued.
- A designated swine flu ward i.e. B-5101 has been made functional for swine flu patients.
- Online indenting of drugs, surgical items, linen and miscellaneous items have been started in all areas of the hospital.

- Separate Disability Cell has been established to facilitate the care of disabled patients and also for issue of Disability Certificate.
- Separate isolation area has been constructed inside overflow ward (Area-53), Level V, Block A with capacity to accommodate 8-10 patients of tuberculosis.

ONGOING PROGRAMS 2018-2019

- Installation of 3 composting machines, 200 Kg capacity each is in process.
- Setting up of Effluent Treatment Plant- Survey has been conducted.
- Construction of Sports Injury centre in sector-32 will be started soon.
- Construction of additional hostels for MBBS students and residents in sector-48. Drawings have been sent to Architect department for revision.
- The floor plan for Mother and Child care centre (Block-K) has been approved and the drawings have been approved.
- The drawings for construction of Emergency and Trauma Block in front of existing Emergency have been prepared and approved.

PROPOSED PROGRAMME 2019-2020

- Construction of Sports Injury centre in sector-32.
- Construction of Emergency and Trauma Block.
- Construction of Mother and Child care centre (Block-K).
- Construction of additional hostels for MBBS students and residents in sector-48.
- Multilevel parking in the existing ground level parking has been proposed for parking of 500 nos. cars.
- Installation of PET-SPECT scan.
